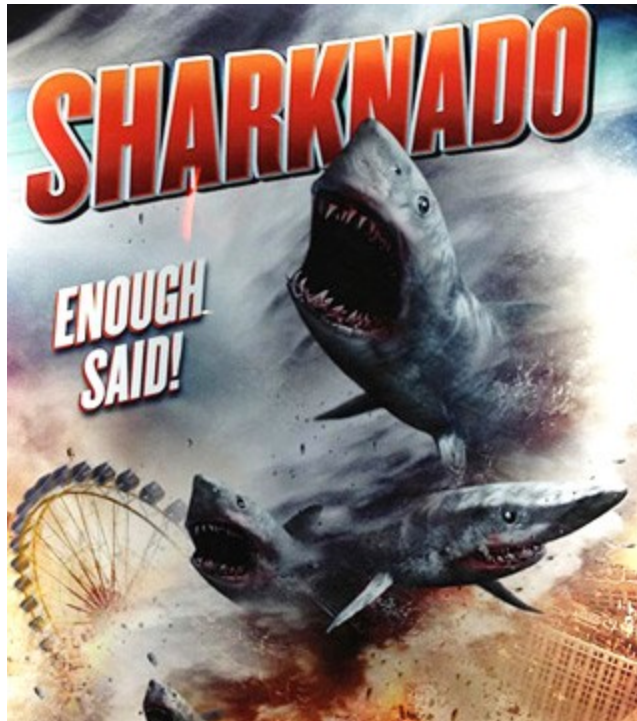

Friday, April 11, 2014 to Sunday, April 13, 2014

- Theme:** Emergency preparedness
- Fees:** \$12 per scout and leader. This covers the costs of the campsite and weekend parking permit for Great Parks of Hamilton County. - Check-in:** Friday, April 11 5:00 PM to 10:00 PM
- Event Agenda:** The camporee agenda is included in this packet. A revised agenda, reflecting any changes will be available at registration and will be posted at the camporee headquarters.
- Stations:** Detailed descriptions of the stations are included in this packet. Station descriptions and maps will be available at the Friday evening cracker barrel. Each Scout must have a filled out Blue Card, signed by the Scoutmaster. **BLUE CARDS WILL NOT BE PROVIDED.**
- Campfire:** Saturday night will feature a Campfire. For the Campfire, please let Jay know if your Troop wants present a skit or song. All skits and songs will be reviewed for scout appropriateness. The campfire will be concluded with an Order of the Arrow Call-Out.
- O.A. Call-Out:** There will be an Order of the Arrow Call-Out at the Saturday night campfire. The names of those to be called out need to be turned in to headquarters at the time of the troop registration.
- Food:** Each Troop should bring its own food for all meals. Patrol cooking is encouraged for all meals.
- Water:** Water is available at camp.



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- Webelos:** Troops are encouraged to invite Webelos dens from their respective feeder Packs.
- Fires:** Ground fires are not permitted. Above ground fire rings may be used.
- Trash:** All Troops are responsible for throwing away their own trash and policing their area after the camporee.
- Cancellation:** No refunds are available. If we have severe weather, the campout could be canceled and money would be refunded.
- Lost & Found:** Camporee headquarters will serve as a lost and found for the event.
- Checkout:** A camporee staff member must sign out every unit. After your unit has completed their site clean-up and have packed up their gear, a representative should go to the camporee headquarters and arrange to have a staff member inspect their site. Once the site has been inspected, the staff member will issue patches and collect an event feedback form.

Spring Camporee Rules and Reminders

Scoutmasters, please review with your scouts prior to the campout.

- **Fires should only be in above the ground fire rings. Please bring your own wood. Absolutely no ground fires! No open flames are permitted in tents.**
- **No littering. Remember the outdoor code – Leave No Trace.**
- **Webelos are welcome to participate as a patrol or part of an existing patrol.**
- **Adults are welcome to accompany patrols during the events.**
- **Unit leaders should ensure that all their unit participants are properly prepared for weather conditions including proper footwear. Any participant deemed by a staff member to be unprepared will be asked to leave the camporee.**
- **Due to hazards hiking boots or equivalent must be worn. No flip flops or open toed shoes allowed.**

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Scored events

Scouts will form into patrols of up to six youth per patrol to participate in events.
Events will be timed rotation and points given for the successful completion of the tasks.

Stations

1. "Blow up the Shark"

Youth will shoot paint balls into Shark's mouth scoring given for # of clear shots into the mouth.

2. "Reassemble the shark for the Marine Biologist"

Patrol will work as a team directed by one youth from their group to assemble a Giant Shark puzzle. Scored on fastest assembly time.

3. "Fishing for Sharks"

Youth will use fishing poles to "Snag a Species of shark" Scores awarded for number of "Catches" per patrol.

4. "Cross the Shark Infested water"

Patrols will walk 30' of boards crossing Shark infested water. Points awarded for number of youth crossed without being eaten.

5. "Bandage the Shark Bites"

Points given to patrols for proper use of First aid rendered to serious shark bites, points awarded for proper use of tourniquets, and any available emergency supplies.

6. "Rescue your Fellow scouts from the rising water"

Patrols will work together to rescue another group using ropes and knot tying to bring the stranded group out of harms way before the waters rise.

7. "Plywood the Windows"

Scouts will use a standard hammer to drive 16 penny nail into a lumber . Points awarded for amount of nails driven to full depth without bending for a secure attachment of your plywood.

8. "Rescue the injured"

Patrols will determine severity of injury and best use a variety of lift and carry techniques, stretchers, Blankets, maybe even a body bag if necessary to move the severely wounded properly to a safe Triage area out of harms way. Points awarded on their correct choices and technique.

9. "Toast the Shark"

Patrols will have carry fire starting material be prepared to start a fire quickly and eliminate the the baby sharks before they grow to full size..

10. "Dissect the Shark"

Patrols will have to be prepared to dissect the shark for further examination (Hint, a small wood cutting bow saw may b a help). Points awarded on number of pieces dissected.

11. "Harpoon the Great White"

Using a bow and arrow points awarded for number of hits into the "Kill" zone.
Note, this event is contingent on a BSA approved archery range officer availability.

Additional points will be awarded to attentive sharp eyed Patrols whom observe a variety of species of "Tagged" sharks worn by adult volunteers and staff and getting their Tracking cards signed.

There will be a "SPAMNADOE" cooking contest for all participating troops so bring your best Scout SPAM recipe to be judged.
